


Satchel Student Guide


1) Type In following link in the browser and click on Student

Make a Greek Theatre style mask 13B/IB1

Task description

Research, design and make a mask in the style of those used in Greek theatre:

1. **Choose a character from Greek theatre or Greek mythology.** It might be a god, such as Aphrodite or Zeus, a creature like Medusa or the Minotaur, or a mortal, such as Hercules or Pandora. It might be a character from Greek literature, such as Oedipus or Antigone.
2. **Research the character** - especially what they might look like and what their **ruling emotion** might be - and also research what Greek theatre masks looked like.
3. **Make your mask.** You can choose what materials you use, such as plain mask from a hobby store, or a mask you make from papier-mache or modrock. Use colours to signify / symbolise aspects of their character or emotion. Add materials for hair or any other details you think are appropriate.
4. **Bring your mask to the drama lesson** (check the deadline) where you will use it to create a piece of drama, and it will be formally assessed.

Task description

Task

You must explain the journey of a cheese sandwich through your digestive system. You can choose to explain your ideas through either:

- writing a story
- drawing a storyboard
- producing a power-point presentation

Top tips:

- Describe what happens in each organ of the digestive system
- Consider which food groups are in a cheese sandwich
- Explain where the different food groups are digested according to the enzymes produced. Include the products of digestion

Suggested keywords: absorption, amino acids, amylase, anus, ascorbate, bile, carbohydrate, carbohydrase, catalase, chemical, denaturation, digestion, dissolve, emulsification, enzyme, fatty acids, hydrochloric acid, gallbladder, glycerol, large intestine, lipase, lipid, liver, maltose, mouth, neutralise, oesophagus, optimum pH, pancreas, peristalsis, physiological, protease, protein, rectum, saliva, small intestine, starch, stomach, teeth, tongue
