

The common room was transformed into a disco and DJ Fish, also known as the Nurture Teacher, was on the decks, playing today's hits along with some classics from the '80s.



A huge thank you to all the staff and students who participated and voted. We are incredibly proud of the effort and creativity displayed by all our students on the course.






All our students keep moving for improved mental health
